**WHEREAS,** lives are put at risk and substantial property damage is caused by rapidly developing severe thunderstorms, flash floods and lightning strikes; and

WHEREAS, each year public safety personnel put their lives at risk to rescue citizens who become victims of severe thunderstorms, flash floods and lightning strikes; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Tucson and visitors to our community should take proper precautions to protect themselves from these hazards and heed safety warnings during severe weather; and

WHEREAS, the City of Tucson joins the National Weather Service, Tucson Electric Power, Tucson Stormwater Management Section, Tucson Fire, Tucson Police, Tucson CERT, and other local, state and federal safety organizations and our local media partners in recognizing the need to educate all citizens on how to properly respond when severe thunderstorms and flash floods strike our city;
